¹This phrase refers to the Austrian tradition that a wine farmer puts up a couple of conifer or fir twigs above the entrance door of his tavern in order to communicate to guests that this tavern serves the farmers own new wine.

The word itself is ambiguous. It could either mean „something has been put up“ or „something has been unplugged“. In the context of going to a tavern, both meanings might, albeit metaphorically, apply.
